In partnership with the United States Forest Service, the University of Montana is currently conducting a multi-year archaeological and historical study into a unique site located in Western Montana. During the late 1800s, Chinese workers constructed a series of intricate masonry terraces in the Montana Wilderness. Archaeological work during the summer of 2007 will attempt to uncover the forgotten histories of these Chinese immigrants through excavation and survey of the terraces and associated habitations. The site is only accessible by a substantial hike, and field school participants will be required to camp in primitive conditions for three, four-day weeks. Students enrolled in this course will learn surveying and excavation techniques.
