While this plan will fulfill the requirements for the BA in Anthropology with the Forensic Anthropology Option, we can not guarantee that it will fulfill the requirements of the BA in Sociology. Therefore you need to seek the advice of advisors in both majors.

This plan can be completed in under 120 credits. It takes 120 credits to earn a baccalaureate degree. 120 credits translates to an average of 15 credits per semester.

The model schedule provided on p. 2 of this document should be followed as closely as possible to make sure that the proper prerequisite courses are taken in the proper order.
